Concepts About Print

Below is a list of concepts about print your child is expected to know by the end of Kindergarten. Please practice these concepts as you read nightly with your child.

- Show me the front of the book.
- Show me the back of the book
- Show me the title of the book.
- Show me where it tells the story.

 Your child should point to the words, not the picture.
- Show me where we start reading.
- Show me which direction we go when we read.
 Your child should follow the text with their finger from left to right.
- Show me what we do when we get to the end of the line.
 Your child should return sweep with their finger to go to the next line of text.
- Show me one letter. Show me two letters.
 Have your child use index cards to hide all the letters but one/two at a time.
- Name three letters on the page.
- Show me one word. Show me two words.
 Have your child use index cards to hide all the words but one/two at a time.
- Show me the first word on the page.
- Show me the last word on the page.
- Show me the first letter in a word.
- Show me the last letter in a word.
- Show me a capital letter.
- Show me a lowercase letter.
- Show me a period. What does it mean?
 A period means to stop because it is the end of the sentence.
- Show me a question mark. What does it mean?
 A question mark means you are asking a question. Have your child demonstrate their understanding by asking you a question.
- Point to the words as I read the story to you.
 Make sure your child is pointing to each word as you read.
 Their pointing should be crisp...like a frog hopping to each word, not like a snake sliding to each word.

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
